




ORGANIZATIONAL CHART






ACADEMIC ORGANOGRAM

Initially known as Lahore Medical College in 1886. Both the college and the attached hospital (Lahore Dispensary) were small compared to the current size.

The first academic building was completed in 1883. The university and the attached hospitals were built piece by piece by the funding and efforts of several dedicated people in the coming years.

In December 21, 1911, Lahore Medical College was rechristened King Edward Medical College, and was updated to the status of an independent, degree-granting university on May 12, 2005





- Understand the use of LMS and social media for learning.
- Develop personal development goals.





First DALK in Mayo Hospital

This quarter, eleven cornea transplants were performed at the Institute of Ophthalmology, Mayo Hospital, Lahore. Led by Prof. Dr. Moin and performed by Dr. Sidrah Latif, the procedures included the institute's first-ever Deep Anterior Lamellar Keratoplasty (DALK) on a young patient with keratoconus.

DALK replaces only the front (anterior) layers of the cornea, mainly the epithelium, which significantly lowers the risk of graft rejection compared to full-thickness corneal transplants.





















Prof. Mahmood Ayaz, Vice Chancellor KEMU, told the media, "Orthoptists play a vital role in restoring and improving vision through the use of non-surgical methods of eye care. Their expertise in treating amblyopia, strabismus, and other visual problems is crucial for the effective management of eye conditions (June 2, 2025).



To mark this success, on occasion of 42nd Lahore Ophthalmo, a special combined event was organized by the National Trachoma Task Force (NTTF) Pakistan and Ophthalmological Society of Pakistan (OSP) to recognize efforts of all stakeholders and management staff who have worked for this achievement where certificates and shields were distributed to all major stakeholders. Glimpses from 42nd Lahore Ophthalmo held, December 6-8, 2024.

Optometrists and COAVS graduates participated in 42nd Lahore Ophthalmo and appeared in different sessions with their research and publications.

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A seminar on retinopathy of prematurity (ROP), a leading cause of blindness in premature infants, was organized by Prof. Muhammad Moin and Dr. Saman Ali. A pilot project aims to extend ROP screening services to remote areas in Sheikhupura, Muridke, and Kamonki districts. Dr. Umar Khalil Mian, a renowned ROP specialist and the guest speaker, expressed that the initiative is crucial in improving the eye health of premature babies in Pakistan.

Prof. Dr. Karim Damji, Inaugural Chair of the Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences at the Aga Khan University, Karachi, presented a lecture on "The Journey of Publishing Research in Ophthalmology" during the 44th session of KEMUCON on December 9, 2024. Prof. Karim Damji was awarded with Prof. Munir ul Haq lecture Award by Principal COAVS for excellence in Teaching, Research, Humanism and Global Health on the occasion.

Community Eye Care





COAVS teams performed **myopia screening** in primary schools for children aged 4-16 years to mark the occasion of World Sight Day, 2024. For this purpose, 20 screeners and 3 optometrists for triage were trained on PEEK technology. They conducted child screenings for three days, screening 1200 children in total. Seventy glasses were dispensed to the children in need.



Events were held at RHC Qadir Pur Rawan, Govt. Elementary School, Sadiqabad Mills and Thatha Tarran, Shiekhupura where awareness walks and eye health sessions were conducted. The events were organized to celebrate World Sight Day under Inspire Project being run in collaboration with Sightsavers, urging regular eye check-ups. A large number of school students participated in activities symbolizing unity in vision care.

To celebrate World Sight Day 2024, 15 Refraction booths were set up at Basic Health Units (BHUs) across the district of Layyah, screening a total of 4,524 individuals, including 2,039 children. With 660 refractions performed, 456 individuals were prescribed corrective glasses.







On World Sight Day, a significant awareness seminar and walk were held in **District Layyah** under the Inclusive Eye Health Project. The seminar gathered 250 participants, including students, teachers, parents, members of the local community, health department, persons with disabilities, media representatives, and civil society.

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The Project Review Meeting of Inspire run in collaboration with Sightsavers, was held in Islamabad on November 14, 2024. Program teams from Sightsavers and the college, along with field teams comprising project officers and 30 Optometrists, joined the meeting. Key outcomes included a comprehensive review of project progress, identification of challenges with proposed solutions, and a strategic emphasis on financial sustainability and inclusivity for future phases.



A strategic meeting was held to discuss the five-year country strategy for The Fred Hollows Foundation Pakistan, on December 16, 2024. Prof. Muhammad Moin emphasized the importance of a robust data management system and AI for improving diabetic retinopathy diagnosis. Ms. Rashin Chaudhry, Advisor Program Development, expressed gratitude to COAVS and reaffrimed the commitment to support advancing eye health in Pakistan.

International Peek Certification Workshop was organized in Hyderabad in National Coordinator Office, Pakistan from 9 to 13 December 2024. Peek Vision has certified the Pakistan Teams as Independent Master Trainers Pakistan for Peek Implementation in Pakistan and international partners. Punjab Peek Implementation team, have scored 94 %, the best score among all World Level Peek Implementing Teams.







Team conducted refresher training on Peek Capture Technology and vision screening for 120 Lady Health Workers in District Layyah, in collaboration with CBM. Focused on identifying vision problems and improving screening effectiveness.



Chapter-14: Office of Resource Generation/ Development

14.1 Initiatives and implementation

Development schemes plan is updated as per requirements raised by end users and approved by Vice Chancellor.

Financial plan in form of annual/ cost estimate is prepared yearly as per requirement by P&D department by qualified Engineers posted in the department. Drafted proposal is forwarded to Treasure Department for financial scrutiny and funds availability status. Then Plans approved by the Competent Authority (Vice Chancellor).

For mega projects, PC-I forwarded to funding authority for approval and availability of funds in coming financial year. This proposal is also reviewed/checked by concerned committees of the University.

P&D Department prepares the list of development schemes to be executed in coming years along with-it rough cost estimate. The same schemes are sent to treasurer office for confirmation of funds availability to execute. The Treasurer Department present these schemes in Finance & Planning Committee at first stage for its recommendation, then to the syndicate and senate for final approval. However, in case of mega development projects funded through ADPs and PSDPs, funding agency releases the grant as per financial phasing of the projects subject to availability of funds.

Campus Committee under the Chairmanship of Vice Chancellor and Monitoring Committee evaluate the plans at initial, interim, and final stage of projects. In addition to above, HEC and Punjab Government also evaluate the plan in their Project Progress Review Meetings. (ADPs/PSDPs) through physical and financial progress targets.

Master Plan of KEMU Campus is available and updated with the subsequent infrastructure development executed with the approval of Syndicate, Government of Punjab, and Higher education commission.

Master Plan of New Campus of KEMU is in progress and will be ready for approval soon.

KEMU has successfully submitted the PC-IV (Project Completion Report) of following Development Project funded through PSDPs:

- 1. Strengthening of KEMU, Lahore.
- 2. Construction of Girls Hostel at KEMU, Lahore.

However, the concept Note has also been submitted to HEC for Establishment of New Campus of KEMU at Muridke-Narowal Road, District Sheikhupura.

Conceptual plans of following schemes submitted to HEC and SHC& ME department Govt. of the Punjab.

- Construction of Admin and Academic Block (Establishment of New Campus KEMU).
- Establishment of Undergraduates Skills Lab at KEMU, Lahore.
